- In Exodus 20:1-17 God gives the 10 Commandments (the Law) to Moses
 - Whose law is it? It came from a perfect and loving God
 - Why did He give it? For the good of the people: maintain fellowship with God and establish good order
 - Do they still apply today?

Absolutely, they're good for all people at all times

- Be diligent to do them



- The first four commandments deal with our relationship with God
 - Thou shalt have none other gods before me.
 - Thou shalt not make thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing...
 - Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain
 - Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.



- The next six commandments deal with our relationship with people
 - Honour thy father and thy mother
 - Thou shalt not
 - Kill
 - communit adultery
 - Steal
 - bear false witness
 - covet



- Jesus condensed all the commandments into two
- Matthew 22:35-40 Then one of them, which was a lawyer, asked him a question, tempting him, and saying, Master, which is the great commandment in the law? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. 40 On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. 72777 X2 CET SC
